## 영어 영역 듣기 평가 대본

1. 다음을 듣고, 남자가 하는 말의 목적으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Attention, Fargo High School students. This is your music teacher, Mr. Nelson. Our school rock band was supposed to hold its concert in the auditorium today. I'm sure you've been looking forward to the concert. Unfortunately, the rain yesterday caused a leak in the ceiling of the auditorium. The ceiling needs to be fixed, so we decided to change the location of the concert. The rock band will now perform in the school theater. The time for the concert hasn't changed. I hope you'll enjoy the performance.

2. 대화를 듣고, 여자의 의견으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

W: Simon, are you doing anything after school?

M: Nothing special. What about you?

W: I'm planning to go for a run in the park. It's a five-kilometer route.

M: The weather is perfect for running. Can I go with you?

W: Why not? *[Pause]* Wait! You're wearing slippers. Those aren't good for running.

M: It's okay. I can run in slippers.

W: No way. Slippers aren't designed for running. You can get hurt if you run in them.

M: You mean I need to put on running shoes?

W: You got it. You need to wear the right shoes for running.

M: All right. I'll go home and change.

M: Good morning, Ms. Clapton. It's nice to meet you.

W: Nice to meet you, too. I'm a fan of your articles.

M: You won many awards at the film festival this year. Congratulations!

M: The clothes and accessories in the movie are impressive. How do you start your costume designs?

W: I read the script to fully understand the characters. Then I research the characters' backgrounds.

M: That sounds like a lot of work. Which of the costumes from this film is your favorite?

W: It's hard to pick just one because I love all of my designs.

M: I totally understand. Thank you for sharing your story with the readers of our magazine.

W: It was my pleasure.

M: Isn't there anyone else who can look after your cat?

W: No one but me. My parents are visiting relatives in Canada. They won't be back for two weeks.

M: I'm sorry that you can't join us.

W: Me, too. Have fun this weekend.

Today, we'll learn how cities deal with the problems caused by overtourism. First, some cities limit the number of hotels so there are fewer places for visitors to stay. In Barcelona, building new hotels is not allowed in the city center. Second, other cities promote areas away from popular sites. For instance, Amsterdam encourages tourists to visit less-crowded areas. Third, many cities have tried to limit access. For example, Venice has tried to reduce tourism overall by stopping large cruise ships from docking on the island. Similarly, Paris has focused on reducing tourism to certain parts of the city by having car-restricted areas. Now, let's watch some video clips.
