[16 ~ 17] 다음을 듣고, 물음에 답하십시오.

M: Hello, I'm Paul Woods and you're listening to the One-Minute-Tip for daily lives. Do you think you make the right decision when you buy vegetables? If not, listen carefully now. Let's start with carrots: select carrots that still have greens attached as they indicate freshness. Avoid buying carrots with cracks or green areas at the top. As for cucumbers, choose firm, dark green ones with no wrinkles or spots. Also, make sure they are not dry. Unlike cucumbers, onions with moisture should be avoided. Choose dry, firm ones that feel heavy for their size. Lastly, as for eggplants, choose ones that have smooth, shiny skin. When gently pressed, flesh that bounces back indicates ripeness. Buy smaller eggplants as they tend to be less bitter. I hope this can help you next time you shop for vegetables. Thanks for listening.
