M: Hello, everyone. Do you enjoy traveling? These days, with increasing air travel, more and more people experience jet lag. Jet lag is a temporary physical condition that occurs when a change of time zones affects your body's internal clock. This can disturb your sleep pattern, making you feel drowsy and tired. By following some simple tips, you can avoid the unhealthy consequences of air travel. First, if possible, the week before your departure date, consider the time zone you'll be traveling to and make suitable changes to your daily lifestyle. Also, when you arrive, get outside and be active. Exposure to the sun's rays will aid in your body's adjustment to a new time zone. Another good suggestion is to naturally increase your melatonin levels. Melatonin is the substance that helps regulate sleep. You can increase melatonin production by eating pineapples, bananas, oranges, or tomatoes. Grains such as oats, rice, and barley are great, too. So, be sure to include some of these in your diet for better sleep.
