A very special supply store in New York sells capes, masks, secret identity kits, and practically anything else a superhero might need. The Brooklyn Superhero Supply Co. opened in 2004. Saving the Reef

The Great Barrier Reef is the world's natural wonder. Usually, millions of visitors swim and snorkel in the sparkling blue waters off Australia's northeast coast. They are treated ①___ amazing views of vibrant coral and other color sea life. But (A)this underwater treasure is facing great danger. According ②___ the Australian Institute of Marine Science, the reef has lost 50% of its coral in the past 30 years due to water pollution and climate change. More recently, waste ③___ the construction of ports is harming this fragile ecosystem.

The reef system is made up of more than 2,900 connected coral formations and 900 islands. The system stretches ④___ about 2,272 kilometers. More than 1,600 kinds of fish live there. In 1975, the Australian government protected the reef (B)그것을 해양 공원이란 이름 지음으로써. It became a UNESCO World Heritage site in 1981.
