7. 대화를 듣고, 남자가 할 일로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

W: Hey, Kevin. What are you watching on TV?
M: I'm watching the whole season of *Sherlock Holmes*.
W: Have you just been sitting around all day watching it?
M: Yeah, that show is so addictive. I just couldn't stop.
W: You'd better stop now. This place is a mess! Mom said we should clean everything up and decorate it for the party tomorrow.
M: Don't worry. I'll turn the TV off.
W: Kevin, we'd better divide the work. I'll clean it up. You go out and buy some decorations.
M: Good. Tell me what I should buy.
W: Get some balloons, flowers, and candles.
M: Okay. Do you know when Mom will come back home?
W: She said she'll come around 6 o'clock.
M: Then I'll be back before she comes back.

W: Mr. Thomson, are you feeling good these days?

W: I also asked you to do some weight-lifting. How's it going?
M: Two weeks ago I signed up for a fitness club in my neighborhood.
W: Great. I'm sure regular weight-lifting will help you get out of your back problem.
M: Actually I'm working really hard.
W: Good. Do you go to the fitness club early in the morning?
M: No. I go there at night because I can work out as long as I want.
W: It might be hard for you to find enough time early in the morning
M: Right. I have to go to work early.
W: I see.

M: Hi, everyone? Are you prone to bad dreams? A new study published in the journal *Dreaming* found that there are some things that affect what pops up in your dreams. Firstly, our dreams are influenced by noise. You wake up after dreaming you're stuck in a burning building and realize that the fire alarm you heard was actually your alarm clock. Secondly, our brain interprets smells as a signal. The scent of roses gives people pleasant dreams while the scent of rotten eggs gives strange dreams to people. Thirdly, indigestion causes nightmares. When you have difficulty digesting spicy foods or a big meal, you have a higher chance of having a bad dream. Lastly, your sleeping posture affects your dreams. For example, sleeping on your stomach increases the chances you'll have a strange dream. If you want to dream a good dream, take a few minutes to remind yourself of happy thoughts, like vacation memories, or favorite moments with your kids before settling down to sleep.
