## 영어 영역 듣기 평가 대본

1. 다음을 듣고, 남자가 하는 말의 목적으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Good afternoon. I'm Tom Anderson, the student council president. I'm glad to announce that the student council is recruiting volunteers for our campus tour event. Next Saturday, our school will be welcoming middle schoolers who are interested in attending our school. Student volunteers will show the middle schoolers around our campus, and provide them with useful information about our school's extracurricular activities and traditions. To sign up to volunteer, please visit our school website. Your participation will be a great help to those who wish to attend our school.

2. 대화를 듣고, 여자의 의견으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

W: David, the screen on your cell phone looks cracked. What happened?

M: I accidentally dropped it on the bathroom floor last week.

W: That's too bad, but why haven't you fixed it yet?

M: It's working perfectly fine, so I don't think I need to fix it.

W: Well, I think it's better to get a phone fixed immediately when the screen is cracked.

M: I don't think a small crack like this is a big deal.

W: It may look okay, but a single crack can break the whole screen over time.

M: Really? I didn't know that.

W: Also, tiny pieces of glass from the cracked screen could cut your face or your fingers.

M: Hmm.... That could be dangerous.

W: Exactly. That's why you should fix a cracked phone screen as soon as possible.

M: You're right. I'll get it repaired today.

3. 대화를 듣고, 두 사람의 관계를 가장 잘 나타낸 것을 고르시오.

[Phone rings.]

W: Hello.

M: Hello. Can I speak to Ms. Norton?

W: This is she.

M: Hi, this is Mark Kelly from Polaris Studio. I heard you were a scientific advisor on the movie *Space Dynasty*.

W: Yes, I helped the writers with the script.

M: I thought the script was well written and had many entertaining scenes related to science.

W: Thank you. It was a lot of fun.

M: I'm actually writing a script for a science fiction movie right now, and I was wondering if you could help me with your expertise.

W: Okay. What's the movie about?

M: It's about natural disasters caused by global warming. I need advice from science experts like you to make it more realistic.

W: I'd be interested. I've done a lot of scientific research on global warming in my lab. My findings might be useful for you.

M: Fantastic! I'll send you my script. Thank you so much.

4. 대화를 듣고, 그림에서 대화의 내용과 일치하지 않는 것을 고르시오.

M: Hello, Ms. Clark. How's it going with rearranging your classroom?

W: Good morning, Mr. Cooper. It's almost done. Do you want to see a picture of what it looks like?

M: Sure. *[Pause]* Oh, I see a round clock on the wall. It looks nice.

W: Yes. I replaced the old clock with a new one.

M: I also like the bookcase under the window.

W: I put it there to make it easier for students to read books. How do you like the stripe-patterned rug?

M: I like it. It goes well with the classroom. By the way, what are the two boxes on the table for?

W: I'll put some classroom supplies in them. I also put a flower pot in the corner.

M: Great idea! I think your students will really like the new classroom.

W: Thank you.

5. 대화를 듣고, 남자가 할 일로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Mom, I'm home.

W: Hi, Brian. How was your violin lesson?

M: It was fun. I think my violin skills have improved a lot.

W: Good! By the way, did you see the pile of clothes in the living room?

M: Yeah. I wore those clothes when I was a little kid. Are you going to throw them away?

W: No. I'm going to give them to charity today.

M: Oh, so you want to donate the clothes?

W: Yes. They're all in good condition and they've been dry-cleaned.

M: That's great. Is there anything I can help you with?

W: Well, I need some boxes to put the clothes in.

M: No worries. I'll bring some from the garage.

W: Thanks, but be careful. The lights in the garage aren't working.

M: I got it, Mom. I'll be right back.

6. 대화를 듣고, 여자가 지불할 금액을 고르시오. [3점]

M: Welcome to Platinum Hillside Resort. How can I help you?

W: Hi. I want to reserve an outdoor barbecue table for tonight.

M: Okay, right now we have small tables for four people and large tables for eight people available.

W: I'd like to reserve two small tables.

M: Sure, it's \$25 per table. Do you also want to try our salad bar?

W: How much is it?

M: It's \$30 per table.

W: No, thanks. That won't be necessary. I'll just reserve the two tables.

M: Okay. Are you currently a guest at our resort? If you are, you can get a 10% discount.

W: Yes, I'm staying in room 609. My name is May Jones.

M: *[Typing sound]* Okay, Ms. Jones. We've confirmed you're a guest. How would you like to pay for your tables?

W: I'll pay by credit card.



7. 대화를 듣고, 남자가 식당에서 식사를 하지 못한 이유를 고르시오.

W: Hey, Mike. How was dinner at the French restaurant downtown last weekend? I heard it was recently renovated.

M: Well, I went there, but I didn't get to eat anything.

W: Why? Were there too many people waiting in line?

M: Not really. There were tables available.

W: Did you bring your dog and the restaurant said no?

M: No, I checked their website and it said I could sit with my dog at an outdoor table.

W: Okay, so then why couldn't you eat anything?

M: The restaurant said they ran out of ingredients, so I left.

W: Oh, you must have been disappointed. How about we go there for lunch this Saturday?

M: Sounds great! They don't take reservations on weekends, so we should get there early.

W: Good idea. I look forward to it.

8. 대화를 듣고, Home Organization Class에 관해 언급되지 않은 것을 고르시오.

M: Honey, check out this advertisement.

W: Okay, let me see. *[Pause]* Oh, Home Organization Class? That sounds interesting.

M: Yeah, it does. How about we take the class together? We can learn some tips for organizing and cleaning our house.

W: Great idea. Look, the class will be held at the community center. It's just a ten-minute walk from here.

M: Right. And it's on Saturday, September 30th, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m. Is that okay with you?

W: Yes, my schedule is free on that day. How much is the class?

M: It's \$20 per person.

W: That's reasonable. Is there anything we need to prepare for the class?

M: Yes. We have to bring some pictures of our living room and other rooms in our house.

W: Okay. I'll do that.

M: Great. Let's sign up for the class.

9. 2023 Board Game Design Contest에 관한 다음 내용을 듣고, 일치하지 않는 것을 고르시오.

W: Hello, viewers. The 2023 Board Game Design Contest is an annual event for designing board games. It's open to board game fans of all ages around the world. The contest is split into two rounds. In round one, contestants must submit a 2-minute video introducing their games. In round two, contestants must hand in a document that explains how to play their game. During round two, contestants get the chance to work with experienced game designers who will help each contestant with establishing the rules for their game. The final winner of the contest receives \$1,000, plus a chance to release his or her game. Registration closes on Friday, September 15th. Show us your skills as a game designer!

10. 다음 표를 보면서 대화를 듣고, 두 사람이 주문할 제품을 고르시오.

W: Sean, look what I found for mom for her birthday.

M: I'm at the mall, and I just saw the hiking shoes you wanted are on sale.

W: Really? We didn't buy them the other day because they were too expensive.

M: Yeah, but they're 50% off now. Do you want me to buy you a pair?

W: Yes, that'd be lovely.

M: You wear a size six for your shoes, right?

W: Yeah, but for hiking shoes, I usually wear a size seven.

M: Hmm.... Wouldn't they be too big for your feet?

W: No, they're fine. My feet get easily swollen while hiking, so I prefer wearing hiking shoes that aren't too tight.

W: Plus, I usually wear thick socks when hiking, so buying a size six wouldn't work for me.

However, after asking the clerk about the prices, they find the dresses are too expensive for their budget. At this moment, Kate realizes that it'd be better to rent the dresses for their concert at a rental shop. So, Kate wants to suggest to Claire that they borrow dresses rather than spend a lot of money on buying new dresses. In this situation, what would Kate most likely say to Claire?

W: Hello, students. Weddings are held all over the world, but the way they're celebrated varies greatly. Today, we'll learn about unique wedding customs in different countries. In Germany, for example, newlyweds cut a log in half using a large saw. By cutting the log together, the couple shows their willingness to cope with difficulties in their marriage. Next, in Cuba, wedding guests have to pay to dance with the bride. The money is then used to pay for wedding expenses. Thirdly, it's traditional to have a tea ceremony at weddings in China. The couple serves tea to both sides of their families to show their respect and gratitude. Lastly, in Australia, guests hold stones during the wedding ceremony. When it's over, they place the stones in a decorated bowl, and it's given to the couple as a reminder of the support from their family and friends. Now, let's watch a video of these wedding customs.
