3. 다음을 듣고, 남자가 하는 말의 목적으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: It's a hot summer day. Dave and his mother are reading books in the living room with the electric fan on. Even with the fan, it's still so hot that he can't focus on his book. Dave is sweating and asks his mother to switch on the air-conditioner. She agrees that it's time to start using it and allows him to turn it on. Dave rushes to the air-conditioner with a big smile. Suddenly, she remembers reading an article about the dangers of dust in air conditioners. The article said it's important to keep them clean. She really wants to remove the dust from the filter before using it. Dave is about to hit the "ON" button. In this situation, what would Dave's mother most likely say to Dave?

[16~17] 다음을 듣고, 물음에 답하십시오.

W: Nursing moms need to eat! A well-balanced diet with foods you like is best. However, certain foods—no matter how much you love them—may not agree with your baby. Spicy foods, like onions and chili peppers, may upset an infant's stomach, so eat them in limited amounts. Some citrus fruits, such as oranges and lemons, may be rough on your baby's tummy. Limit your intake depending upon your baby's reaction to these foods. When you drink coffee, some of the caffeine ends up in your breast milk. Caffeine should be limited to small amounts so that it doesn't disturb the baby's sleep patterns. You need to have vegetables in your diet, but certain ones should be eaten only in small quantities because they may give the baby gas. These vegetables include cabbage and broccoli. A baby who is breastfed from a mother who eats peanuts may develop a peanut allergy. Therefore, when eating, moms should always proceed with caution.
