## 영어 영역 듣기 평가 대본

1. 다음을 듣고, 남자가 하는 말의 목적으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Hello, residents. This is an announcement from the maintenance office. Last week, we conducted a safety inspection of the apartments and found some inappropriate uses of the balconies. Please be aware of the rules for using balconies as follows. First, balconies should not be used for the storage of goods, such as barbecue fuel materials which can cause a fire. Second, lightweight outdoor furniture should be removed when winds are strong because the objects can be blown off of the balcony. Lastly, please avoid watering plants too much to prevent flooding. Thank you for your cooperation for your safe and pleasant residence.

2. 대화를 듣고, 여자의 의견으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Grace, I'm thinking about learning Korean. But I don't know where to start.

W: Why do you want to learn it?

W: Great, thanks! I look forward to more of your amazing pictures!

W: That dress was one of my favorites. I was grateful that I received so many presents that day.

M: I was happy, too. Just look at the gift boxes beside you.

W: It was really a great celebration for our whole family!

5. 대화를 듣고, 남자가 할 일로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: We can use a delivery app.

W: Sounds good. *[Pause]* How about tuna sandwiches or chicken sandwiches?

M: How much are they?

W: Tuna sandwiches are \$8 each and chicken sandwiches are \$6 each.

M: Let's have just tuna sandwiches.

W: Okay, I'll add ten of them to our order. We also need beverages.

M: Sure. I think bottled water would be good for everyone.

W: They're \$1 each. I'll add ten bottles.

M: Please check if they have a delivery fee.

M: Yeah. I ran down the stairs as quickly as I could, but the bus drove away right before my eyes.

W: I'm sorry that you had a tough morning. How did you get to school?

M: The subway. Fortunately, it was quite empty, so I could read the presentation material for history class.

But Nicky, another member of his band, thinks if they work with musicians of the seemingly distant genre, they'd be able to present a different side of their music. So, Nicky wants to suggest to Chris that their team take the offer to collaborate in an attempt to play music they've never done before. In this situation, what would Nicky most likely say to Chris?

M: Hello, students. Have you ever heard a market analyst or an investment banker use animal references? It's because such expressions give you some insight into the financial industry. I'll introduce some examples of what animals represent in the market. Let's start with bulls. You've probably seen them raising their horns when they attack. So a 'bull market' represents a period when prices are generally rising. The next one is sheep. As they move in a herd, the 'sheep-flock effect' means a bias that influences the decisions of investors, often causing irrational reactions. Pigs are also fairly common in finance-speak. They are used to define investors who are greedy and take high risks in anticipation of making huge profits. Finally, chicken indicates investors who are reluctant to take risks and prefer a safer approach. From these few examples, you can get an idea of the variety of financial vocabulary. Why don't you look for other examples and find your favorite one?
